
THE BALLPARK WITH AN OAKLAND ATTITUDE

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# 1. OUR DESIGN OBJECTIVE:

A ballpark that is classic, one of a kind, and brimming with Oakland grit and swagger.



2. WOW FACTOR

#### Wow Factor

Over time the retro ballpark has lost its originality. A tweak here, a tweak there. The same shirt and tie, just different colors. The result has been the proliferation of ballparks that lack the wow factor Camden Yards brought to the table 25 years ago. These safe designs are a perfect match for most baseball cities, but they re entirely unsuitable for Oakland. Oakland and the Ar demand something different something bold. The Colosseum design bridges the gap between ballparks that are nice and predictable and a ballpark with wow factor.

## Instant Classic

The Colosseum would be an instant classic. Fans and players walking into the ballpark today would have the same feeling as fans and players 50 years from now that they are on hallowed ground.

#### International Destination

When designing Oaklands ballpark, whats wrong with thinking big? Would people travel long distances to see a Colosseum? The answer is a resounding yes. They would travel from across the Bay. They would pour in from the corners of America. They would arrive from overseas. After all, what conscientious tour of sports stadia would be complete without a visit to the worlds only functioning Colosseum?



3. MAKING AN OAKLAND STATEMENT

#### No There There

Oakland is less about place than attitude. Oakland is known more for its fighting spirit and tenacity than its sights and buildings. But what would Oakland fighting spirit look like if it were encapsulated in architectural form? A Colosseum.

## Making an Oakland Statement

The Colosseum design makes a bold Oakland statement. It isnot a stock design that gives a few nods to Oakland. It isnot a design beamed in from an architectural firm halfway across the country, let alone halfway across the world. It grew out of an Oakland consciousness. Ito gritty. Ito nonconformist. Ito Oakland.

# Living Memorial

We do not believe a ballpark should be a franchisecs best feature. Rather, it should serve as a showcase for the important events happening on the field—and the important events of the past. The Colosseum is a living memorial to the great history of the Oakland Acs. The past and present are connected. When you watch a game at the Colosseum, you feel you are living history.

## Muscular Sophistication

Though visually pleasing, the Colosseum makes it clear that the business transacted on the field is the most important aspect of the trip to the ballpark. This isnot just another sunny day at the ballpark. Something important maybe even historic is going to occur at the ballpark today. This isnot another happy-go-lucky ballpark itos the ballpark of champions. But all spectators are welcome. The less brutish types will visit the Colosseum for the refinement that comes with unwinding in a piece of classical architecture. Muscular sophistication will be the order of the day. The wine will flow like beer at the Colosseum.

# Colossally Small


# **Gravity**


# Appreciating Asset

# 7. UNIQUE FEATURES

## <u>Beacon</u>

#### Oak Grove



Baseball talent reigns supreme on the playing field, and talented architects are kept where they belong. on the other side of the fence.


## Athletic Baseball

Outfields with balanced dimensions and scalable walls make for a more excitingmore athletic- brand of baseball. We want outfielders to have their bearings as they
approach the wall. What more fun- watching an outfielder streaking toward the
wall with abandon, or watching a disoriented outfielder proceeding gingerly to the
wall? What more exciting- watching a fielder leaping high above the wall to pull a
sure homerun back into the park, or watching him stagger around the warning track,
leaping high for a ball that bounces off the base of the wall? Why do we set our
heroes up for failure? Shouldn ballparks be designed to encourage highlight reel
plays instead of blooper reel plays?

## Redeeming Nature's Most Perfect Form

Its an article of faith among retro ballpark hardliners that round or symmetrical ballpark designs are bad. This is a reaction- and an appropriate one- to the widespread dual-use (baseball / football) monstrosities constructed during the 1960s and 1970s. But the paradigm has flipped. The contrived, angular ballparks have become the new cookie cutter stadiums. Today, the round ballpark is a rarity. In 1992 HOK shook up the world of ballpark design with the unveiling of Camden Yards. A number of great ballparks followed suit, but 25 years down the road its time for a fresh design.
